




PRAYER OF CONFESSION

* OLD TESTAMENT SCRIPTURE: Psalm 80:1-7

¹ Hear us, Shepherd of Israel, you who lead Joseph like a flock. You who sit enthroned between the cherubim, shine forth² before Ephraim, Benjamin and Manasseh. ¹ "Very truly I tell you Pharisees, anyone who does not enter the sheep pen by the gate, but climbs in by some other way, is a thief and a robber. ² The one who enters by the gate is the shepherd of the sheep. ³ The gatekeeper opens the gate for him, and the sheep listen to his voice. He calls his own sheep by name and leads them out. ⁴ When he has brought out all his own, he goes on ahead of them, and his sheep follow him because they know his voice. ⁵ But they will never follow a stranger; in fact, they will run away from him because they do not recognize a stranger's voice." ⁶ Jesus used this figure of speech, but the Pharisees did not understand what he was telling them. ⁷ Therefore Jesus said again, "Very truly I tell you, I am the gate for the sheep. ⁸ All who have come before me are thieves and robbers, but the sheep have not listened to them. ⁹ I am the gate; whoever enters through me will be saved. They will come in and go out, and find pasture. ¹⁰ The thief comes only to steal and kill and destroy; I have come that they may have life, and have it to the full." NIV

Candidates for Elder

Larry Funck grew up in a Christian family. He says, "My first step of faith occurred at an early age in response, with my grandmother's encouragement, to a traditional altar call. As an adult my faith has been deepened largely by my appreciation of the magnificence of God's creative power revealed by modern science." At Immanuel Larry has participated on the finance committee and in the choir. As an elder he hopes to assist the spiritual growth of this local body of believers.

Carl Pickard can't remember a time when he hasn't known Jesus as Lord and Savior: "One of my earliest recollections of actual proactive understanding of what that means was reading and embracing Catherine Marshall's *A Man Called Peter*. My upbringing was a mosaic of Congregational, Methodist, Baptist, and interdenominational influence. At Gordon College I embraced the Presbyterian ecumen and the Westminster Confession." Carl and Judy joined Immanuel in 1998. Since then he has served several terms as Ruling Elder, as Interim Moderator between the pastorates of Mateen and George, on Executive Committee, Finance Committee, and as Chairman of Personnel Committee. He and Judy have been active volunteers and leaders at the food pantry since its inception in April 2012. He says, "My only goal if elected to another term as elder is to serve the IPC family and help to provide direction and counsel as needed."

Cathy Sayer values many characteristics of Immanuel's life and worship, especially the strong bonds wrought through inter-generational family life, the glorification of God through the sharing of artistic gifts, and the love of Christ expressed in the broader community through the Food Pantry and partnerships with other faith-based service efforts. Cathy has been a member of Immanuel since December 2021. She serves on the Adult Education Committee, has co-taught an Adult Ed class, has served as substitute teacher for the Tuesday women's Bible study, assists monthly with Children in Worship, and volunteers at the food pantry on Tuesdays. Her favorite post-retirement occupation is spending time with her four children and five grandchildren; she also enjoys spending time in nature, reading, journaling, puzzling, watching good movies, and occasionally sewing.

Candidates for Deacon

Kathy Wetters has been a member since 2021. She and her husband, Brian, were impressed from their first visit by the traditional Bible-based worship service and genuine warmth of the congregation. They enjoy being greeters on the third Sunday each month, attending Prime Timers, and volunteering on Sundays and Tuesdays at the food pantry. The family moved to Geneva in 2000 and currently operate an in-home care agency in Batavia. Visiting their young grandchildren in Oklahoma several times per year brings them great joy.

Sharon Wolgemuth has been a member of IPC since November 2013. She and her husband, Ken, were initially drawn to Immanuel because they loved the worship, the music, and the traditional hymns. They enjoy being part of a small group that started soon after their membership class. Sharon serves as part of the Mission Team, helping to put together the International Cafes several times a year. She has been a part of Vacation Bible School. She works in the nursery and attends the Women's Bible Study and Prime Timers. She has recently served as a Stephen Minister. The Wolgemuths have four daughters and seven granddaughters. They consider it a highlight of their week that they get to be the homeschool teachers of their two youngest granddaughters on Thursdays.
