and for all that we have left undone.



Prayers during Communion

Prayer to begin a new life in Christ

Dear God, I recognize Jesus came to earth to die on the cross for the sins of your people. I want to recognize now that he came to earth to die for *my* sins. I confess that I am a sinner in need of your grace and the saving blood of Christ. Please forgive me of my sins through the perfect sacrifice of your Son who died in my place. Jesus, come into my heart and change me from the inside out. Help me to truly repent from my previous way of living without you, and help me to surrender to your rule over my life as my Savior and Lord. Thank you for your Spirit that reveals to me the new life that I have in Christ and empowers me to walk in obedience to your truth and will for me. Amen.

Prayer for those struggling with sin

Merciful God, I am thankful that as your child I am not defined by my sin. Help me to walk in obedience to you in all areas of my life. Forgive me for the particular area(s) where I still succumb to temptation and disobey you. Help me to remember that in every area where I am tempted, your word promises that you will provide a way out of those temptations. Fill me with your Spirit, which working in me can do what I cannot do on my own. Help me to walk in obedience to your commands and also delight in them and your guiding words of truth. Please give me the courage to reach out to others in the body of Christ for strength and support when I am especially vulnerable. Amen.

Prayer for those wrestling with doubts and fears

Gracious God, even as your child I wrestle with the fact that your will for me is perfect and that you will supply all of my needs. Help me to set my mind on the truths of your word, and guard my heart when the enemy clouds my mind and heart with fear and doubt. Help me to rest in the peace and security of being your child, and by your Spirit testify with my spirit that I am yours when feelings tell me otherwise. Remind me of your love and delight in me as your child. Amen.

Prayer for those seeking freedom from their past

Almighty God, you have the power to set us free from the sins and entanglements of our past. Release me from the shackles of my past that I carry that you have released me from. Forgive me for holding my past against me in the ways that you do not, and enable me to grasp what it is for you to see me in the perfect righteousness of your Son, both now and forever. May your Spirit, the Spirit of liberty, liberate me from any thought or feeling that belies the fact that I am completely forgiven, or free to live the new life in Christ I have as your new creation. Amen.

THE SCOT'S FORM OF COMMUNION

Many of the early Reformation churches practiced communion in this way: as the congregation sang, the people came in turns to a table set at the front of the sanctuary or often to tables set in the aisles. There they were seated and served, and then returned singing to their places in the congregation.

The early Scottish Presbyterians felt strongly that their manner of partaking of the Lord's Supper should clearly symbolize the truth that the Risen Christ is host to his redeemed people at his covenant meal; a spiritual meal where believers are nourished by the life of Christ provided by his finished work of redemption. Thus, for example, Samuel Rutherford wrote that "they should sit, as banqueters, at one table with our King, and eat and drink..." And George Gillespie said, "We ought to come to the table of the Lord to receive the mystical food in the sacrament, as well as we come to our ordinary table for our ordinary food." And in Holland, years later, Abraham Kuyper expressed his opinion that the Lord's Supper should be eaten from a table, saying "Jesus spreads a feast for his friends, and as a King invites his people to his table."

For several years we in our congregation have used this form largely for the same reasons as expressed by our Reformed and Presbyterian predecessors and also have discovered reasons in our experience to value this observance of the Sacrament. The form demands a little more from us than the modern tradition of being served at our places in the congregation. As we overcome our nervousness about going forward we find that that very act impresses upon us the reality of our personal response to our Lord's invitation to receive his grace. Sitting with others at this table; singing and watching while others go forward may likewise impress upon us the reality of our fellowship and the joy of seeing others respond to and meet our Lord in his love.

NOTICE TO FAMILIES

In accord with our practice of the Lord's Supper, children and adults who have not yet appeared before the elders to profess their faith in Christ are asked to refrain from partaking in the communion. It is our desire that they look forward gladly to the day when they take their first communion as a significant step in their spiritual growth and acceptance of the responsibilities of church membership. In the meantime, we want to provide ways in which they may come to understand the meaning of the sacrament and also feel that they are significant persons in the covenant family of God. We would like to invite those people to come forward to the Table and be seated with us. The elder who serves the elements will briefly offer prayer for them. So that the elders may know whom at the Table to pray for in this way, we would suggest folding their hands on the Table. The parents of children may also help to indicate such children to the elders. We hope this custom will encourage adults and children as they grow and prepare for the time when they are ready to profess Christ in church membership.
