

Giving Update: God's faithfulness has once again been demonstrated by strong giving for the first quarter of 2023. Through last Sunday, giving to the General Fund was \$199,377, \$9,000 ahead of projections (based on giving patterns over the past three years). Projections for the second quarter anticipate growth in giving over the first quarter, before we enter a "summer slump" in the third quarter, so we appreciate many who are able to give consistently through the year.

Prayer to begin a new life in Christ
