





YEAR-END GIVING

'Tis the season for fund raising appeals. The good news is that year-to-date giving for Immanuel is ahead of our projections. That leaves just over \$72,000 in December to meet our budget goal of \$808,600. To count toward the current budget and your own 2022 tax records, remember that the last offering will be Christmas Day. Any donations brought to the church office must be received by Friday, December 30. Donations sent by mail must be postmarked by December 31. (If you bank online be aware that there is often a delay before the bank mails your check).
