

People: While I kept silence, my body wasted away through my groaning all day long.


Leader: For day and night your hand was heavy upon me; my strength was dried up as by the heat of summer.

This class will explore topics and ways how Christians can engage our friends and co-workers as we talk about questions of "fairness" (or justice) and "does the punishment fit the crime."
