

How to Read the Bible (sanctuary)

Often, Christians are told, "You need to read the Bible," but we usually receive no guidance on how to do this. To read the Bible well, we need an approach for reading it that aligns with the nature of the Bible itself. This four-week class draws upon *Savoring Scripture: A Six-Step Guide to Studying the Bible* to guide us in reading the Bible in a way that not only leads to greater historical understanding but ultimately to communion with God and faithful living.

Andy Abernethy is Professor of Old Testament at Wheaton College and the author of numerous books, including Savoring Scripture: A Six-Step Guide to Studying the Bible (IVP). Andy has been married to Katie for thirteen years, and all three of his children were baptized at Immanuel.
