

All: For our sins against light and knowledge,



SESSION 3 • January 5—February 16

Christianity and American Politics: Lessons from the Past for the Present

Mark Noll meets in the Sanctuary

This class is a non-partisan examination of crucial times in American history when political and Christian commitments were intermingled. It tries to show how better understanding of far-away events like the French & Indian War, the Election of 1800, and the American Civil War might help believers keep our political balance today.

Although Mark Noll was a history professor for almost thirty years at Wheaton College and for a decade at the University of Notre Dame, he considers adult ed classes at Immanuel his most challenging and most rewarding experiences as a teacher. Mark and his wife, Maggie, are long-time members.

Grandparenting: Loving Our Children's Children

Phyllis and Andy Le Peau and other Immanuel grandparents meets in Pastor's office

Grandparents have a special role in the lives of children. Together we'll explore how we can bless our grandchildren in a variety of ways and meet some of the challenges. Each session will focus on what we can learn from the Scripture and from each other's stories. We will consider topics like prayer, favoritism, forgiveness, nurturing contentment, loving the parents of our grandchildren, learning to let the next generation lead, and more.

Andy and Phyllis Le Peau have attended Immanuel since its inception and served in a variety of roles, most recently for Phyllis as elder and for Andy as a K-2 Sunday school teacher. They have thirteen world-class grandchildren and are the authors of several books and Bible study quides including the LifeGuide Bible Study Grandparenting, which will be the basis for the class.

Youth Membership Class (6th - 12th grade)

IPC youth will learn about the essential doctrines our faith, what it means to be a part of a church community, and how to share your testimony of faith. At the conclusion of the class, youth will have the option of pursuing IPC membership (but this is not required). We ask at least one parent to attend this important class with their child.
