



2022 Giving Report and 2023 Challenge

Thanks to God for his provision through your continued generosity. The \$857,138 given to the General Fund in 2022 was not only well above the original budget of \$808,600, but above projected year-end expenses of roughly \$827,000 (which allowed expansion of the budget moving into 2023—more on that at the Annual Meeting February 5). Continuing the exuberant giving of the past few years will allow us to not simply meet the budget but rise to fresh challenges that will increase Immanuel's kingdom impact.

CANDIDATES FOR ELDER

Bill France and Debby came to Immanuel in 2017 after their church of 25-plus years closed due to low attendance. Trained to work hard and wholeheartedly in his 22 years in the U.S. Army, Bill jumped in immediately, helping with the social team and memorial services, with the food pantry, and as treasurer for the missions team. Bill looks forward to helping Session as it reaches out to the church family to promote its spiritual growth. In Bill's free time, he builds wooden ship models and writes books he self-publishes on Kindle.

Sarah Holman and Colin came to Immanuel at the invitation of her colleague, Mary Hopper, back when the congregation was still meeting at the College of DuPage. She has served in the Music Ministry, Children in Worship/Following Jesus, Nature Camp/Vacation Bible School, and Sunday School. She previously served as an Elder and traveled with the Arizona Missions Trip. She looks forward to supporting the ministries of Immanuel and collaborating in prayer with Elders, Deacons, and church leadership. In her free time she most enjoys spending time with her family, Colin, Nathaniel and Sylvia, and Timothy.

CANDIDATES FOR DEACON
