

2022 Giving Report and 2023 Challenge

Thanks to God for his provision through your continued generosity. The \$857,138 given to the General Fund in 2022 was not only well above the original budget of \$808,600, but above projected year-end expenses of roughly \$827,000 (which allowed expansion of the budget moving into 2023—more on that at the Annual Meeting February 5). Continuing the exuberant giving of the past few years will allow us to not simply meet the budget but rise to fresh challenges that will increase Immanuel's kingdom impact.

CANDIDATES FOR ELDER

Bill France and Debby came to Immanuel in 2017 after their church of 25-plus years closed due to low attendance. Trained to work hard and wholeheartedly in his 22 years in the U.S. Army, Bill jumped in immediately, helping with the social team and memorial services, with the food pantry, and as treasurer for the missions team.
