

Reader: Then I acknowledged my sin to you, and did not cover up my iniquity.


People: I said, "I will confess my transgression to the Lord"--and you forgave the


PRAYER OF CONFESSION

In Immanuel and Beyond

Easter is coming! We plan to worship outdoors, rain or shine. If your family has a small portable canopy, plan to bring it on Easter morning. The church has purchased several 10x10 canopies, so that many can be under shade or out of the rain, depending on the weather. We need quite a number of early volunteers on Easter Sunday morning to help put up the canopies, etc. Contact Annette if you're willing to help.

Bells and Crosses: In true Immanuel tradition, plan to bring along bells on Easter Sunday morning to ring during all the Alleluias. Since we won't be able to go forward to flower the large cross, families are encouraged to bring along small crosses to "lift high" during worship. If you get to the Saturday before Easter and still need to find or make a cross, watch for an opportunity to come by the church parking lot to make simple crosses for worship.

Witnesses to the Resurrection: Traditionally, we use some pages of the Easter Sunday bulletin to remember loved ones who have gone before us to be with the Lord. If you'd like to have a loved one listed, email Barb at immanpres@gmail.com with the name, like this: *Charles and Catherine LaPlaca, Parents/grandparents of the LaPlaca family.* Instead of purchasing flowers, consider a suggested donation of \$10 for our food pantry ("pantry" in the memo line).

From the Finance Committee: 2020 could have been a disastrous year financially, but we stand in awe of the way God blessed Immanuel through your response to ongoing needs as well as the renovation project. It is truly amazing! It is not too early in 2021 to remind you that Session has approved a budget increase of about four percent. Think of it this way: for every \$100 you gave to the general fund last year, we need to raise \$104 this year. It is with joyful anticipation that we look forward to God's continued blessing in 2021!
