

Jesus Christ the righteous.


All: And he is the atoning sacrifice for our sins,

Traveling through Another Dimension: Christians, Culture, and the Twilight Zone
Michael Kendrick and Ron Netzel

This class will explore topics and ways how Christians can engage our friends and co-workers as we talk about questions of "fairness" (or justice) and "does the punishment fit the crime."
