

Deuteronomy: The Heartbeat of the Old Testament

The goal of this course is to survey the content and theology of this rich book by examining one text each week that is paradigmatic of a key theme. We also will reflect on the way that the New Testament assumes and builds on these themes from Deuteronomy.

Cooper Smith earned his Ph.D. from Wheaton College, where he teaches Old Testament as an adjunct instructor. Cooper and his wife, Marie, have been worshipping and participating at Immanuel since 2016. They have two daughters, Abby and Lilah.
