



All: If we confess our sins, he who is faithful and just will forgive us our sins and cleanse us from all unrighteousness.


Leader: If anyone does sin, we have an advocate with the Father, Jesus Christ the righteous.



- * OLD TESTAMENT SCRIPTURE: Genesis 29:15-30
 - ¹⁵ Laban said to him, "Just because you are a relative of mine, should you work for me for nothing? Tell me what your wages should be."
 - ¹⁶ Now Laban had two daughters; the name of the older was Leah, and the name of the younger was Rachel. ¹⁷ Leah had weak eyes, but Rachel had a lovely figure and was beautiful. ¹⁸ Jacob was in love with Rachel and said, "I'll work for you seven years in return for your younger daughter Rachel."
 - ¹⁹ Laban said, "It's better that I give her to you than to some other man. Stay here with me." ²⁰ So Jacob served seven years to get Rachel, but they seemed like only a few days to him because of his love for her.
 - ²¹ Then Jacob said to Laban, "Give me my wife. My time is completed, and I want to make love to her."
 - ²² So Laban brought together all the people of the place and gave a feast. ²³ But when evening came, he took his daughter Leah and brought her to Jacob, and Jacob made love to her. ²⁴ And Laban gave his servant Zilpah to his daughter as her attendant.
 - ²⁵ When morning came, there was Leah! So Jacob said to Laban, "What is this you have done to me? I served you for Rachel, didn't I? Why have you deceived me?"
 - ²⁶ Laban replied, "It is not our custom here to give the younger daughter in marriage before the older one. ²⁷ Finish this daughter's bridal week; then we will give you the younger one also, in return for another seven years of work."
 - ²⁸ And Jacob did so. He finished the week with Leah, and then Laban gave him his daughter Rachel to be his wife. ²⁹ Laban gave his servant Bilhah to his daughter Rachel as her attendant. ³⁰ Jacob made love to Rachel also, and his love for Rachel was greater than his love for Leah. And he worked for Laban another seven years. NIV
- * NEW TESTAMENT SCRIPTURE: John 1:6-13
 - ⁶ There was a man sent from God whose name was John. ⁷ He came as a witness to testify concerning that light, so that through him all might believe. ⁸ He himself was not the light; he came only as a witness to the light.

⁹ The true light that gives light to everyone was coming into the world. ¹⁰ He was in the world, and though the world was made through him, the world did not recognize him. ¹¹ He came to that which was his own, but his own did not receive him. ¹² Yet to all who did receive him, to those who believed in his name, he gave the right to become children of God— ¹³ children born not of natural descent, nor of human decision or a husband's will, but born of God. A Disruptive Hope: Advent through an Old Testament Lens

Andy Abernethy Ministry House

The Christmas season in America works against the very concept of Advent in the church calendar. The "most wonderful time of the year" hypnotizes us into thinking that life doesn't get any better than this. We become blind to the darkness or simply accept it as is, and we cease yearning for the Light to come again. In this class, we will allow passages from the Old Testament, especially Isaiah, to quicken our hearts to celebrate the joy and disruption of God with us.

Andy Abernethy is an Associate Professor of Old Testament at Wheaton College. He and his wife, Katie, have been members of Immanuel for 5 years. They have three little ones: Anna (7), Bethany (5), and Oliver (1).

Stress Is Good for You! Nate Thom
Sanctuary

In this series we'll gain a deeper understanding of the relationship between brain and soul, how the brain functions, what stress is, how stress affects the brain and body, and how to prevent the negative effects of stress on brain and body.

Nate Thom is an Associate Professor of Biology at Wheaton College. Dr. Thom studies ways to promote an adaptive response to stress. He began this work in graduate school at the University of Georgia by evaluating the effects of exercise on brain function and behavioral outcomes, extended this research to cognitive training programs like mindfulness during his post-doc with the Navy, and is now applying this research to missionaries at Wheaton College. Dr. Thom lives in Wheaton with his wife, Sarah, and four young boys and enjoys spending as much time outdoors as he possibly can.
