



IN IMMANUEL AND BEYOND

GIVING UPDATE: With giving at \$615,000, we ended the third quarter (October 31) within one percent of our giving goal. That puts us on target for the remaining \$167,000, or 21% of our budget for November and December. With expenses below budget because of COVID and reduced activity during renovation, we are in a position to end the year very well, poised to move ahead in 2022. Speaking of Renovation, which we celebrated last Sunday, the Immanuel family is to be commended for its remarkable support, which amounted to more than a million dollars over the past three years—on top of very strong ongoing support for all IPC ministries. We thank God for using you to bless his work at Immanuel.
