

is laid bare. When we stand in the living presence of truth, our own


falsehood is revealed.



ENVISION THE FUTURE AT IMMANUEL

You are invited to join in the God given opportunity to renovate the narthex and lower-level Christian Education space during this restrictive use of our church building, due to the COVID pandemic.

Imagine an expanded narthex with three restrooms and a servery. This larger space is made possible by moving the nursery to the lower level.

The remodeled lower level Christian Education space will include the nursery and a redesign of classrooms, restrooms, kitchen, and fellowship area.

Total cost for this part of the renovation is \$726,000. We already have \$345,000, leaving \$381,000 to raise.

To make better use of the Ministry House facility for our youth and Christian education, it is proposed that the interior be redesigned at a cost of \$165,000.

Funds needed for both buildings - \$546,000

The plan is to raise much of the total amount in the next three months. Please pray and ask God to enable you to join in this work – **His work.**
