

- * OLD TESTAMENT SCRIPTURE: Psalm 64
 - ¹ Hear me, my God, as I voice my complaint; protect my life from the threat of the enemy.
 - ² Hide me from the conspiracy of the wicked, from the plots of evildoers.
 - ³ They sharpen their tongues like swords and aim cruel words like deadly arrows.
 - ⁴ They shoot from ambush at the innocent; they shoot suddenly, without fear.
 - ⁵ They encourage each other in evil plans, they talk about hiding their snares; they say, "Who will see it?"
 - ⁶ They plot injustice and say,
 "We have devised a perfect plan!"
 Surely the human mind and heart are cunning.
 - ⁷ But God will shoot them with his arrows; they will suddenly be struck down.
 - ⁸ He will turn their own tongues against them and bring them to ruin;
 - all who see them will shake their heads in scorn.

SYMBOLS OF THE CHRISTIAN FAITH

Special thanks to the sewing team of Immanuel members who created the banners currently enhancing our worship in the sanctuary, which depict important symbols of Christian faith:



Alpha and Omega: The first and last letters of the Greek alphabet symbolize Jesus as the beginning and end of all things and are associated with the Trinity (Rev. 22:13).



Chi Rho: Since the time of Constantine, this symbol derived from the first two letters of the Greek word for Christ emphasizes the Great Shepherd, as the Greek letter rho looks a bit like a shepherd's staff.



Lion holding the Cross: The lion is one of the messianic titles (Gen. 49:9, Rev. 5:5) and represents royal dominion, strength and courage, and justice.



Lamb: Christ is the lamb of God who takes away the sins of the world (John 1:29 and many other references).



Hand of God: The hand, a symbol of power and making the gesture of a blessing, is a physical representation for God the Father. The hand of God creates and protects, provides security and support, but also metes out judgment.



Dove: This primary symbol for the Holy Spirit also indicates God's peace and reconciliation with humankind.
